The Revised Program Grant

The program will begin on Monday, January 6, 2020 and end on Thursday, May 28, 2020

The program serves both elementary and intermediate schools

- Three (3) groups of fifteen (15) schools per group will be served each rotation which will last for a period of twelve (12) weeks
- At the end of each 12-week term, teachers will rotate to another group of fifteen (15) schools
- Teachers are responsible for transporting the appropriate instruments to the next assignment
- (Instructional Support Providers may be able to assist—see more below.)
- Each rotation will serve approximately 586 TK-8 students
- At the conclusion of all 3 rotations, 1,760 TK-8 students per school year will have been served (40 students per school at 44 schools)

The Assignment

- Each teacher will serve two schools; one school on Monday and Wednesday and another school on Tuesday and Thursday
- There is no program on Friday
- The daily work schedule is 3 hours per day x 4 days per week for a total of 12 hours weekly
- The hourly rate of pay is \$38.00
- Teachers are expected to report to their schools 30 min prior to the beginning of the first class and stay at least 30 min to help with clean-up after last class
- Start time depends on the individual school schedule
- Each teacher will teach two (2) classes daily consisting of approximately one hour each
- Average enrollment will be 20 students per class for a total of 40 students daily
- A “draft” schedule will be provided at the end of this meeting.

Overall Curriculum Concept

- Elementary school programs (grades K-3/4) will focus on singing
- Guitar will be introduced to students in elementary grades 4/6
- We are waiting to hear how many guitars may be ordered to be provided to elementary schools to be used in the upper grades but their focus should also continue to be on singing while accompanying themselves
- Intermediate school programs should provide full instrumentation to all students
- Intermediate school programs should continue to focus on singing as well as learning the instruments and students should rotate singing and playing at each rehearsal
- There is only one school which will have a high school program

Student Performances

- A student performance will be provided at the end of each 12-week rotation to demonstrate what the students have learned
- Performances will feature students singing as well as playing (i.e. instrument rotation will be necessary) so that all students have the opportunity to do both except in case of the trumpet unless separate mouthpieces are available

Instruments

The Mariachi Heritage Society has 120 total instruments to be equally distributed:

- 30 violins (Each of 15 schools will get 2 violins)
- 30 trumpets (Each of 15 schools will get 2 trumpets)
- 30 guitars (Each of 15 schools will get 2 guitars)
- 15 vihuelas (Each of 15 schools will get 1 vihuela)
- 15 guitarrones (Each of 15 schools will get 1 guitarron)
- Additional $\frac{3}{4}$ size guitars will be ordered once the prices/shipping are confirmed

Instruments will be distributed according to grade level

- Grades K-3/4 focus on singing only
- Grades 4-5/6 focus on singing as well as playing guitar only—choose 2-3 chords for appropriate keys and learn to play the songs that are being taught vocally
- Intermediate schools will be provided with the remaining instruments equally each rotation

Instructional Support Providers

Each teacher will be assigned an instructional provider to assist in the delivery of services related to student supervision, academic assistance; and health and wellness facilitation; and

- Work with and instruct students individually and/or in small and large groups
- Implement effective classroom management, discipline and instructional strategies
- Set up activities on a daily basis; prepare and duplicate materials and operate instructional equipment
- Monitor and evaluate the instruction and student's progress
- Maintain daily after-school attendance sign-in/sign-out log and other records as required
- Maintain the classroom or learning facility in a clean, organized and healthful manner; storage of materials is required on a daily basis.
- Supervise students in and out of classroom during various after-school activities.
- Maintain frequent and regular parents communication and support parent involvement
- Attend staff meetings/planning/training sessions on a weekly basis or as required.
- Perform related duties as assigned.
